REFLECTIONS ON THE GOSPEL

MAKING POSSIBLE **OUR DWELLING WITH GOD**

We hear today the account of Jesus' cleansing of the Temple as told in the Gospel of John. In this Gospel the incident takes place at the beginning of his public ministry. It nonetheless has direct reference to his death and resurrection.

In vigorously driving out from the Temple the animals destined for sacrifice, Jesus effectively shuts it down as a place of worship. His own body is now to become the sanctuary where God dwells and is to be worshipped. 'Zeal for (his) Father's house' will 'destroy' him in the sense that his attempt to break the confinement of worship to the physical Temple will provoke the hostility that will end with the destruction of his own physical body upon the cross.


But his body will be raised from death as the new sanctuary where his disciples and all subsequent believers will truly 'dwell' with God. In this sense Jesus' whole mission, as it comes to a climax in his death and resurrection, is driven by a consuming zeal to bring about between human beings and God the 'at-homeness' that he enjoys eternally with the Father

It was only in hindsight—after Jesus' death and resurrection—that the disciples realised the full import of his words. At times we may think we have come to terms with the mystery of suffering in our lives. Then it turns up in some fresh form, forcing us to confront it anew.

Every Lent invites us to a deeper appreciation of the Cross as the saving power and wisdom of God.


