#### PLENARY INDULGENCE FOR DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY (8 APRIL)

In 2002, to encourage Catholics to observe Divine Mercy Sunday, Pope St. John Paul II decreed that the precious gift of a plenary indulgence would be attached to the devout celebration of the Feast. A plenary indulgence grants the full remission of the temporal punishment due to sacramentally forgiven sins. The plenary indulgence is granted to the faithful who on Divine Mercy Sunday recite the Our Father, Hail Mary and the Creed for the intentions of the Holy Father, and then venerate the Divine Mercy image itself with a simple



prayer such as "Jesus, I trust in you!" The faithful are also required to receive Holy Communion on that day (or at the vigil), and to make a sacramental confession within 20 days before or after the Feast (This norm was confirmed by the Apostolic Penitentiary of the Holy See on 18 February 2005). As with all plenary indulgences, the faithful can choose to receive it themselves or have it granted to a deceased loved one.

The teaching of scripture is that he must rise from the dead.

It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. She saw that the stone had been moved away from the tomb and came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved. 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb' she said 'and we don't know where they have put him.'

So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, but did not go in. Simon Peter who was following now came up, went right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.

And so I ask you:

P. Do you renounce Satan? All: I do.

P And all his empty show? All: I do.

P. Do you believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth?

P. Do you believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was born of the Virgin Mary, suffered death and was buried, rose again from the dead and is seated at the right hand of the Father?

All: I do.

All: I do.

P. Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting? All: I do.

P. And may almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has given us new birth by water and the Holy Spirit and bestowed on us forgiveness of our sins, keep us by his grace, in Christ Jesus our Lord, for eternal life. All: Amen.

Observing them, our faith cries out: 'Alleluia!'

Now I, and those with me, can witness to everything he did throughout the countryside of Judaea and in Jerusalem itself: and also to the fact that they killed him by hanging him on a tree, yet three days afterwards God raised him to life and allowed him to be seen, not by the whole people but only by certain witnesses God had chosen beforehand. Now we are those witnesses - we have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead - and he has ordered us to proclaim this to his people and to tell them that God has appointed him to judge everyone, alive or dead. It is to him that all the prophets bear this witness: that all who believe in Jesus will have their sins forgiven through his name.'


