Happy Feast Day, Happy Anniversary Fr. Alejandro! On the 24 May, 2003 (17 years ago), Bishop Daniel Jenky of Peoria IL ordained Fr. Alejandro Lopez, OFM Conv. The date, 24 May, also happens to be the Feast of Our Lady, Help of Christians, Patroness of Australia. However, it is an optional memorial in the United States as it is consecrated to Mary under the title of the Immaculate Conception. Imagine Fr. Alejandro's surprise when he arrived in Australia and discovered that his anniversary and the Feast are on the same day! Coincidence?

"O Mary Help of Christians, in our need we turn to you with eyes of love, with empty hands and longing hearts. We look to you that we may see your Son, our Lord. We lift our heads that we may have the bread of life. We open wide our hearts to receive the Prince of Peace. Mother of the Church, your sons and daughters thank you for your trusting word that echoes through the ages, rising from an empty soul made full of grace, prepared by God to welcome the Word to the world, that the world itself might be reborn. In you, the reign of God has dawned, a reign of grace and peace, love and justice, born from the depths of the Word made flesh. The Church throughout the world,

joins you in praising Him whose mercy is from age to age. O Stella Maris, light of every ocean and the mistress of the deep guide the peoples of Oceania across all the dark and stormy seas, that they may reach the haven of peace and light prepared in Him who calmed the sea. Keep all your children safe from harm for the waves are high and we are far from home. As we set forth upon the oceans of the world, and cross the deserts of our time, show us, O Mary, the fruit of your womb, for without your Son we are lost. Daily Masses next week Our Lady of the Rosary Kellyville will be offering daily Mass at 11am and 7pm from Monday 25 May, 2020. Only 10 people will be allowed in the church and 1.5 meters between persons must be maintained. *Thus we ask that you come only once per fortnight to allow others the opportunity to participate in the Eucharist.* You will need to register as required by law. Unfortunately, no one may stand outside. The church will be open from 10.30am and 6.30pm respectively, and closed immediately following the Mass for your protection. Confessions on Saturday Our Lady of the Rosary, Kellyville will offer Confessions on Saturdays from 10-10.30am or until the last penitent is done. Please stand outside and wait until the confessional is open.

Church buildings continue to be closed for the time being Please note that for the safety of our parishioners, and due to the law of Australia, the Bishop has dispensed the obligation of Sunday Mass for Catholics from the Diocese of Parramatta. Please check our Facebook for the latest information on how Covid-19 will impact our services and when our Church will be able to be opened.

Divine Mercy Statue will continue to stand at the foyer of Our Lady of the Rosary Church Kellyville from where he is easily visible from the main doors. Drive up and stay in your car and take time to pray with our Lord. Also note that, though the building doors are locked, the Blessed Sacrament remains in the Church.

REFLECTIONS ON THE GOSPEL
UNFINISHED BUSINESS, ... BUT HOPE

Having escaped the clutches of his enemies by rising from the dead, the Lord ascends, like the prophet Elijah, to heaven.
In biblical language and imagery this manner of describing the close of Jesus’ earthly ministry signals that the One who had been crucified on the trumped-up charge of being a political Messiah has now entered into his true messianic glory at God’s right hand.
This entrance into heavenly glory does not mean that Jesus abandons either his disciples or his saving mission in the world. Rather, he will continue to exercise that mission through the ministry of the Church, empowered (at Pentecost) by the same Spirit that rested upon him.
Just before he departs, the disciples voice an understandable concern: ‘Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?’ The query betrays a strong sense of ‘unfinished business’. Despite the Easter victory, forces hostile to God and to true humanity continue to hold sway in the world – as the disciples, and we ourselves, remain acutely aware.
Jesus does not give a direct answer. The time of the Kingdom’s full arrival remains shrouded in the mystery of God. The disciples’ task, meanwhile, is to take up the messianic mission of Jesus, bringing the hope of the resurrection to an often despairing world.
The Ascension is not, then, simply something that happened to Jesus. As the Preface of the Mass says so well, he ‘has passed beyond our sight, not to abandon us but to be our hope; where he has gone, we hope to follow’.

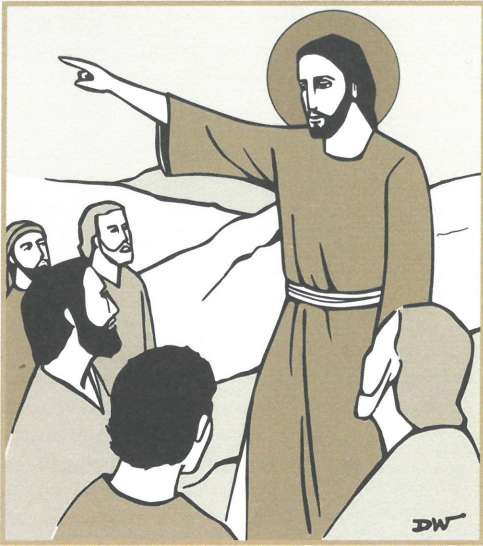

LITURGY OF THE WORD
FIRST READING Acts 1:1-11
A reading from the Acts of the Apostles
Why are you standing here looking into the sky? Jesus has been taken into heaven.
In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. ‘It is’ he had said ‘what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.’
Now having met together, they asked him, ‘Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom of Israel?’ He replied, ‘It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.’
As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, ‘Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.’
