In the fifth in a series, coloured-pencil drawing, Out of Australia I Called My Son, artist Fr. Alejandro López, OFM Conv. continues combining stories of Christ with Australian flora and fauna. Depicted as immigrants from Nigeria, the Holy Family are returning to home after many years abroad. The Child Jesus and his mother, Mary, gaze at us, drawing us in. Joseph's protective gaze remains fixed on his family. Like America, Australia is a land of immigrants. Yet society often denies gifts that come from this pairing while scapegoating foreigners, especially those with darker skin. After Christ's birth, his family fled from a tyrant and sought refuge in a foreign land. Sadly, the desperate flight, and the prejudice they must have also felt, still occur today. Yet all are the same family which God adopted when the Word became Flesh and "pitched his tent among us" (John 1:14). Happily Christ makes His home with us, especially among outcasts. Doing so is a Christmas gift that heals our sight, helping us see the Lord in those whom society rejects. Most beloved by the artist, Australia's "laughing" kookaburra represents the Holy Spirit's delight with Creation. The canine, depicted by a dingo, is a traditional symbol of fidelity. Here, the wild dog represents God's unbreakable, steadfast love. The sun-baked, red rocks of the Outback complete the glowing picture.
