

New Picture of Our Lady of the Southern Cross: The original painting was

blessed by Pope Benedict at World Youth Day in 2008 and hangs in St. Mary's Cathedral. Using Australian icons and motifs, the artist (Paul Newton) was able to create an uniquely Australian image of Our Lady presenting the baby Jesus to the world. Speaking of his painting, Paul said :"The wattle was an obvious symbol as the golden wattle is the national emblem of Australia, and I gave her this

garland instead of giving her a halo or crown... the landscape ... is symbolic on a number of levels. The water flowing through in that meandering river was symbolic of the Holy Spirit as well as in more literal ways suggesting the Australian outback with the scattered gum tress and a barren landscape. It is a twilight sky so I could show both the landscape and the suggestion of the Southern Cross. .."

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

CHALLENGES OF DISCIPLESHIP

As we listen to Jeremiah pouring his heart out to the Lord, it is not unusual for us to be somewhat embarrassed by his candour. It is as though we are eavesdropping on a very personal and private conversation between the suffering prophet and the God who has commissioned him. There is an enormous battle in the heart of Jeremiah as he wrestles with the message he must proclaim and the impact his preaching has on his own life.

Last week Peter was praised because he had come to understand that Jesus was the Christ, the Son of the living God. Now he must learn what the consequences mean for Jesus and then for those who follow in his footsteps as disciples. His well-meaning attempt to protect Jesus is misguided and like Jeremiah, he must struggle to accept the paradoxical and costly ways of God.

The Christians of Rome are encouraged by Paul to continue with the struggle to live a life of faith in a world that did not share their values and vision. In a world where there were many temples, gods and sacrificial banquets, Paul goes to the heart of the matter when he calls for an offering of one's life as a living sacrifice to God.

All the readings for today converge in laying the challenge before us of not losing heart, even though at times the difficulties might seem beyond our strength. Making our own the mind of Christ is not easy, but then again, it never was.


