

FINAL WEEK TO RECEIVE THIS VERY SPECIAL GIFT

Remember - A Plenary Indulgence has been granted by Pope Francis for Catholics who pray before a Nativity scene in a Franciscan Church. To honour St Francis of Assisi and celebrate the 800th anniversary of the approval of the Rule of St. Francis (1223) and the creation of the Nativity scene in Greccio, the following applies.

Between 8 December 2023, (the solemnity of Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary) and 2 February 2024 (feast of the Presentation in the Temple of Our Lord Jesus Christ) by visiting the churches run by Franciscan families throughout the world and stopping to pray in front of the Nativity scenes set up there, a Plenary Indulgence is granted with the conditions below.

Conditions to receive a plenary indulgence in all cases: 1.Detachment from all sin, even venial 2. Sacramental confession, Holy Communion, and prayer for the intentions of the Pope. Sacramental confession which can happen up to about 20 days before or after the act performed to receive a plenary indulgence. It is appropriate that Communion and the prayer take place on the same day that the work is completed. One sacramental confession is sufficient for several plenary indulgences. However for each plenary indulgence one wishes to receive, a separate reception of the Eucharist and a separate prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father are required. For the above mentioned graces offered through the Plenary Indulgence, our Christmas Crib will remain in the Church until 2 February.

What is a Plenary indulgence? A plenary indulgence is a grace granted by the catholic Church through the merits of Jesus Christ, Mary and all the saints to remove the temporal punishment due to sin. The indulgence cleanses a person of all temporal punishment due to sin. However, it must always be accompanied by a full detachment from sin.

impression on them because, unlike the scribes, he taught them with authority.

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

LISTEN

Listening is a central part of being a follower of Christ: listening to the Holy Spirit, to the Word, and to each other. Today we are called to listen and give undivided attention to the Lord, to a prophet like Moses, and to Jesus in the Gospel.

Moses reveals that "God will raise up a prophet like myself from among yourselves, from your own people ... to him you must listen" (Deut 18:15). He reminds the people that this is what they have asked for. In the letter to the Corinthians Paul addresses the anxieties of the community as "the present form of the world is passing away" (1 Cor 7:31). Paul expresses his wish that they be free from anxieties by giving attention to the

The Gospel continues the beginning of Jesus ministry in what I call "Jesus Central" - Capernaum (Kefar Nahum). It is where Jesus made his home during his Galilean ministry. We notice it is Shabbat, the sabbath, and Jesus is in the synagogue teaching. "They" (those in the synagogue) are astounded by his teaching. "They" are listening as he teaches with authority. Juxtaposed with this is the exorcism of an unclean spirit which brings both amazement and the question: "what is this? A new teaching with authority" (v. 27). We hear that his fame spreads, but are they truly listening, and do they recognise who he is? Jesus proclaims the good news in word and deed and expects a change of heart. How are we listening today?


