

This Week: St Vincent De Paul Society Winter Appeal - Supporting the 'Working Homeless' An emerging trend shows people are experiencing housing hardship and disadvantage despite being employed. These are people who hold jobs that should offer stability, yet they're sleeping in cars, tents or relying on the goodwill of others. As housing security becomes more precarious due to rising rents, cost-of-living pressures and a shortage of affordable housing, Vinnies is hearing daily from people who in years gone by would never have needed to seek support. Two years ago, 19% of people seeking assistance in NSW were experiencing homelessness or living in temporary accommodation. Today, that figure has grown to 30%. Funds raised through this week's Winter Appeal will ensure the Vinnies OLOR Conference can continue to provide a 'hand-up' and immediate practical relief to the working homeless and other vulnerable people in the local community.

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

WHO THEN IS THIS?

God speaks out of the storm (tempest) to Job in the first reading asking him whether he was there when God created the world. The imagery of the sea, waves and wind will reappear in our Gospel with the storm on the sea. Following on from last week and the use of parables, Jesus invites the disciples to go across to the other side. This body of water, called a sea, is a lake and subject to squalls and storms at short notice. But let's not get too literal. Note 'they took him in the boat, just as he was'. They left the crowd behind and there were other boats with him.

Quickly the drama of the storm erupts. This great storm has waves swamping the boat. In the midst of this 'he was in the stern asleep on the cushion'. The disciples address him as 'Teacher' asking whether he cares that they are perishing? Waking, Jesus rebukes the wind and says to the sea 'Quiet now, be calm'. The wind ceases and there is calm. Jesus' words transform the great storm to a great calm. Jesus' questions to those in the boat, 'Why are you afraid? Have you still no faith?', are not for them only, but a challenge to us now. Let us hear the words of Paul to the Corinthians: 'if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; behold, everything has
