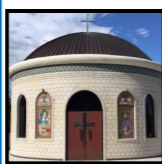

Friday, 2 August, is the Feast of the Portiuncula Indulgence

St. Francis had a vision in which Our Lord appeared to him with the Blessed Virgin Mary surrounded by angels. He asked St. Francis to make a wish. Francis asked that "a full and generous pardon" be given to all who would visit the church of Our Lady of the Angels of the little Portion (The "Portiuncula") on her feast day (August 2). Granted in 1216 by Pope Honorius III, the Portiuncula Indulgence is the first plenary indulgence of the Catholic Church. Since that time, this unique pardon is obtained for the usual conditions of a plenary indulgence, for one's self or for the dead.

The conditions to obtain the Special Plenary Indulgence of the *Portiuncula* are as follows: 1) Sacramental Confession (8 days before or after the feast on August 2); 2) Participation at the Holy Mass and reception of the Holy Eucharist on the special feast; 3) Recitation of The Apostles Creed, Our Father, and a prayer for the Pope's Intentions at our parish church or the Shrine as they are Franciscan.

The Office for Worship will host a Catechesis and Formation Day for those candidates (16+) interested in receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation this year. This will be on Saturday 24 August from 9.30am – 2.00pm at the Bishop Bede Heather Centre, Blacktown. A light lunch will be provided on the day. It is recommended that all sponsors attend the catechesis day. A contribution of \$25 is suggested from the candidates to assist in covering the Catechesis Day. OUR SUNDAY CELEBRATION

SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME / B

28 JULY 2024

One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said, 'There is a small boy here with five barley loaves and two fish; but what is that between so many?' Jesus said to them, 'Make the people sit down.' There was plenty of grass there, and as many as five thousand men sat down. Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and gave them out to all who were sitting ready; he then did the same with the fish, giving out as much as was wanted. When they had eaten enough he said to the disciples, 'Pick up the pieces left over, so that nothing gets wasted.' So they picked them up, and filled twelve hampers with scraps left over from the meal of five barley loaves. The people, seeing this sign that he had given, said, 'This really is the prophet who is to come into the world.' Jesus, who could see they were about to come and take him by force and make him king, escaped back to the hills by himself.

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

BREAD FROM HEAVEN

For the next five weeks we depart from Mark's Gospel and read the majority of John 6. This week we hear the feeding of the 5,000 – a prelude to what is often referred to as the Discourse on the Bread from Heaven. We will listen to this discourse over the next three weeks, and in the final week we will witness some of the disciples turning away from Jesus. If you have the chance read the entire chapter 6 of John in one sitting, you will be able to appreciate better the eucharistic focus of the coming weeks. Intriguingly we have the possibility to hear and perceive something of the eucharistic celebration in the Johannine community.

This week's introduction through the feeding of 5,000, locates Jesus arriving on the other side of the Sea of Galilee. Large crowds follow him enthused by the signs they have seen. Jesus goes up the mountain with his disciples and sits down. We understand this as a teaching posture, recalling Moses. As the story unfolds, we are sensitive that the Passover feast is near. Jesus asks Philip how they will buy bread for all these people. It is an impossible question which Phillip cannot answer. Andrew adds that there is only a boy with five barley loaves and two fish. Jesus takes charge, giving instructions. He takes the loaves, gives thanks and distributes them and the fish to all. At the end of the meal, 12 baskets full of fragments are gathered for later use. The crowds who don't fully understand who Jesus is, acclaim him as a prophet. We see a mixing of Passover and eucharistic traditions in play.

Looking up, Jesus saw the crowds approaching and said to Philip, 'Where can we buy some bread for these people to eat?' He only said this to test Philip; he himself knew exactly what he was going to do. Philip answered, 'Two hundred denarii would only buy enough to give them a small piece each.'
